When my son was home for Christmas, we drove down to Fort Ancient in Oregonia. On their website it says: "Built around 2,000 years ago by the Ancestors of many modern American Indian tribes, Fort Ancient Earthworks and Nature Preserve is... the largest hilltop enclosure in North America. [It was most likely] a gathering place used for ceremonial purposes."

I grew up in New York where we never learned about the ancient peoples who built the mounds in Ohio and other surrounding states. So when we moved here, I quickly became fascinated with the ancient ancestors of the Native Americans. My first view of their work was when I was hiking at Twin Valley Metro Park. I admit I had a hard time figuring out what everyone was talking about. Where were these amazing structures that these ancient people had left behind? Then I realized I was standing right in the middle of them. On first glance they looked like simple piles of leaves. The same is true at Fort Ancient. Once I saw and understood that the "walls" of dirt were built on purpose 2000 years ago, I was awestruck! This was more amazing than any site we visited on our school field trips in New York.

How do you think those ancient people would react if they knew their earthworks had survived 2000 years with museums dedicated to preserving them? Which leads me to the question- what would you like the people of the future to know and learn about Faith Church? I have been told there are "tunnels" under the sanctuary. Imagine those tunnels being discovered 500 years from now. They'd say, hmmm, must have been some kind of ancient heating or water system.

More importantly though, what do we want future people to know about our faith and what we care about? Imagine making a time capsule, not to be opened for at least 500 years. It might contain a Bible, a hymnal, our church by-laws, a Presbyterian Women Study. What else? All of these are important. But things that are intangible are just as important: a supportive phone call or coffee hour conversation, a greeting card sent, camaraderie built around a trip to the Foodbank or a poignant book discussion.

If we want our legacy to endure, let's start with passing it on today through loving words and faithful deeds. I believe Faith Church is very good at doing that. And check out those tunnels! They are pretty cool too.

Worship and Nurture meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 10:00 AM.



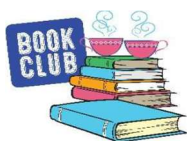
Happy Valentine's Day

FAITH PRESCHOOL HAPPENINGS

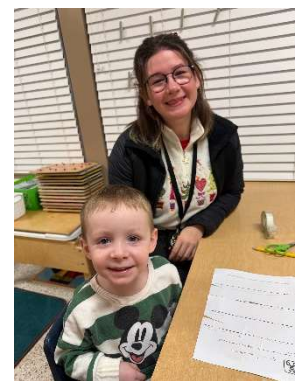

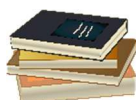
Why do we celebrate Valentine's Day today?

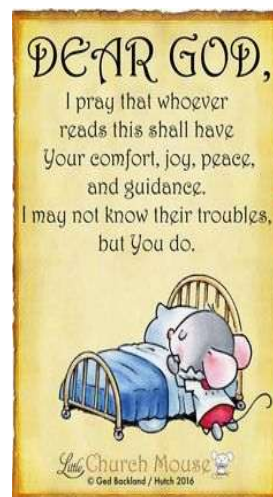


The Huber Heights Food Pantry

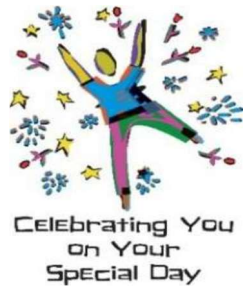

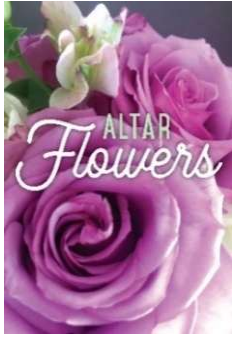
