As I write this, we are just back from a few days on Hilton Head Island, SC. It's a beautiful spot with lots of natural wonder, like trees and beaches. When the Island was being developed, they had a conscious plan to not cut down many trees, so many of the businesses and restaurants are hidden behind the trees and you have to hunt to find them. And there are miles of beautiful beaches. Unfortunately the heat and the jellyfish kept us from spending too much time on the beach. When I was young, I'd spend hours on the beach. But I think those days are over.

I did start out every day with a walk or slow jog on the bike trail though, to take advantage of the shade the trees provided. And the best part of the morning was ending my walk with a stop at a local coffee shop near where we were staying. The first morning I walked in, a bit sweaty, ordered my iced coffee and then pulled a crumpled \$10 bill out of my pocket. I was then a bit surprised when the barista said, "Oh yes, we take cash too." Cash too? I thought that was odd. But then I learned that some businesses are supposedly going to stop taking cash, and only accept non-cash forms of payment.

Why am I telling you this? That conversation in the coffee shop reminded me of how our world is changing in so many different ways. Many of these changes challenge the church to either change along with the world, or not. What is the right path for us? Some changes we have welcomed, like offering a Zoom option for worship, and an automatic withdrawal option for pledges. Other changes I suspect we either aren't ready for, or they aren't right for Faith Church. Like for example, some churches have stopped printing bulletins. Don't worry though! We're not going to do that.

What does it take to be relevant in our changing world and true to ourselves and the Gospel at the same time? That's an important question to ponder. Please share your ideas with me. Meanwhile, let's keep on doing what we do best. There's much to celebrate at Faith Church! Caring for one another and our wider world, getting together in small groups, like Sunday School and Presbyterian Women (both of which start up again this month) and reaching out into the community like we will do at the Marigold Festival on Sept 9.

As we kick off the fall season, I give thanks for all of you and for all we can do together by caring, connecting and serving our community.


Pastor Julia



Session met on August 10 via Zoom. Pastor Julia had her usual busy month. She attended UCC and Presbytery Staff Support committee meetings and CROP Walk planning team. She had three visits, including one with communion.

Approved one-half week carry-over vacation for Julia as provided for in her contract. Elected a commissioner to the September Presbytery meeting. Note that any Ruling Elder can serve as a Presbytery commissioner even if not currently a member of Session. If interested please contact either Pastor Julia or Don Niece. Admin Committee reported approval of up to \$7,500 for miscellaneous maintenance and repair items. Treasurer Diane transferred \$25,000 to a money market fund to improve our interest income.





The CROP Hunger Walk is a nationwide movement sponsored by Church World service to raise funds to end hunger and poverty in the U.S. and around the world. The 2023 Dayton area Crop Hunger Walk is on **October 8**, starting with registration at 1PM at **Shiloh UCC Church in Dayton (5300 Philadelphia Drive** 

**at North Main Street,)** with two possible walks, one on neighboring city streets and the other in the adjacent cemetery. Both are flat, easy walks (about 1/2 mile in the cemetery.)

In prior years we had enjoyed walking in Island MetroPark and Triangle Park, but over time arrangements for walks there became more and more challenging so we switched to Shiloh in 2021.

You can support Faith Church's participation by walking or giving. You can register and/or give online at the link below. Or you can give a donation in the offering plate any Sunday, marked "Crop Walk." Or make out your check directly to CWS/Crop and give it to Pastor Julia. The Dayton Foodbank receives 25% of the Walk proceeds, and Church World Service receives 75% for their work worldwide. Last year's Dayton Area Walk raised more than \$10,516!
